

Michael M. Talley

After Graduating from Michigan State and attending the Columbia Graduate School of Business, Mr. Michael M. Talley ended a four year career as a journalist with CBS News and WCBS Radio and became a Broker with E.F. Hutton & Co. Inc in 1976. In 1980, he joined L.F. Rothschild, Unterberg, Towbin as a Broker and after spending two years with Oppenheimer & Co. Inc., Mr. Talley became a Broker with Ladenburg, Thalmann & Co. in 1990. During that time, Mr. Talley provided, Equity, Debt instruments, IPO's, Secondary's, Insurance Products, and investment advice to a wide range of Individual and Corporate Clients. In 2008, Mr. Talley left Ladenburg, to focus on assisting SEMHIE to build its HIE, serving as co-Program Manager of Healthcare Projects and Pilots and Chairman of the Security & Privacy Sub WG. In 2009, he was elected to the board of SEMHIE and appointed by the board as the Treasurer of SEMHIE.

In 1987, Mr. Talley became a Director of University Bancorp of Ann Arbor, Michigan and today is Lead Independent Director and Chairman of the Audit Committee. In his role as a Director of University Bancorp, Mr. Talley has joined a number of professional Committee and Organizations and has been an active member of the Financial Services Technology Consortium, (FSTC) and sits on the Security and Infrastructure Committee. Mr. Talley through his work as a Director of University Bancorp is a member of the Independent Community Bankers Association, (ICBA) the National Association of Corporate Directors, (NACD), the National Council for Advanced Manufacturing, (NCFAM) and the National Center for Manufacturing Sciences, (NCMS). Mr. Talley sits on various security working groups of the Accredited Standards Committee, (ASC) X9, which is the U.S. ISO standards setting body for the financial services industry, and is an active member and contributor to the Encryption Committee, X9F1 and Security & Privacy Protocols, X9F4.

Mr. Talley has participated in a number of Projects and Pilots, among them: The FSTC Liberty Alliance/SAML project, the Financial Agent Secure Transaction, (FAST Project), and is a member of the current FSTC/E-authentication Project/General Services, (GSA) Federated Identity Management Project for conversion under Presidential mandate of the US Government's business processes to replace "paper" with "electronic". Mr. Talley is a member of the Technical Committee of the Federated Identity Management Project, the Electronic Authentication Partnership, (EAP) and an active member of the "Pilots" Project of the EAP, under the auspices of NACHA, (National Association of Automated Clearing Houses). Mr. Talley is also part of an "Information Assurance" project, sponsored by the NSA/DoD, to develop secure systems to electronically conduct military transactions and provide for the secure sharing of data within a new Pentagon-centric Global Information Grid (GIG) of the US Armed Forces.
